Lastly, here's a tech tip for those that have C5's and C6's (except C6 ZO6's). Some of these models can experience corrosion of wire harnesses near the battery in the engine compartment. Look near the inside of the fender on the passenger side, next to the battery at the wire connections. There may be green and / or white discoloration near the wire connections and on the wires themselves. If you find issues in this area, you may want to have this checked out to eliminate "electronic gremlins" that aren't fun to deal with. Check with Terry Muich if you have further questions on this.

Other than that, continue to get ready for another fun Corvette-ing season!
I'm looking forward to seeing you soon.

Not sure, but I think we may have gone to our first MOCC meeting in March of 2016. I had owned my business for 10 years, and sold it in 2014. I was hoping to reward myself with a cool car. I ended up waiting until 2015 to do that. While still working for the company that bought us out, I began searching for the car. I looked at Aston Martins, Porsches, even Maserati's and Ford GTs. Then it dawned on me; GM had just introduced the C7 so it should be possible to get a good deal on my dream car from childhood – a Corvette! Since the Corvette and I (Holley) were born the same year (1953), it was a no-brainer.

I already had done some research on the C6 and it was already one of my favorite cars, so I began looking. Found a nice, low mileage 2008 with a 6 speed manual in candy-apple red with a biscuit interior at a local Canton dealer, and was about to make a deal on it. Had to go out of town for a couple of days, and when I came back, it was gone. Found another 2008 in black online. Called the dealer and discovered that someone was making the deal on it at the time of the call. 

The Man Who Named The Corvette

Myron Scott recalls when naming the Corvette was just a day's work.

Myron Scott never sought fame for naming the Corvette. Most people would not know he deserves the recognition.

Scott spent 25 years at Chevrolet in the Public Relations Department. He is known to his friends as "Scottie" and his friends include just about everyone he's ever met.

Myron Scott began his career at Chevrolet in 1935 as the Soap Box Derby organizer, which he began two years earlier while working as art director and photographer at the Dayton Daily News in Dayton, Ohio. The success of the original soap box derby aroused Chevrolet's interest. So much so that they sponsored the event and turned it into a national event. Scott returned to the newspaper in 1937 as art director, but Chevrolet lured him away again as assistant advertising manager.

In 1953, there was a meeting of executives. They were to create a name for what would become America's most popular sports car. Scott recalls over three hundred names were shown to the group. Following the reading of the names, the meeting ended with no approved name. Later that evening, Scott opened a dictionary to the "C" section, stopping at "Corvette", a speedy pursuit ship in the British Navy, smaller than a destroyer", he recalls.

Once back at work, Scott wrote a note to Chevrolet Executive, Ed Cole, "How would you like to go for a ride in my Corvette?" About an hour later, Cole called Scott. "How would you like to go for a ride in my Corvette?" he suggested. "What do you mean?" Scott asked. "Yours is the name for our new sports car," Cole said.

Scott cherishes his part in the car's history. "I was just happy in a day's work that I could come up with its name." Scott, who also named the Beauville van, appreciates recognition for naming the Corvette. He has had his share of honors, including the publication of his photos, robins on the windowsill, and having his work reproduced in Life, Look and the New York Times. Yet what gives him the most satisfaction in his career at Chevrolet, as evidenced by the fact he still wears a Soap Box Derby ring, is being the originator of the Soap Box Derby event.

To commemorate his naming of America's favorite sports car, Myron Scott, "Scottie", has worked with Nathan Sheets Collectibles to produce a limited hand autographed promotional car. (See ad elsewhere in Vette Vues.)
